

## Maps for

 Amateur Radio Communications May 5/6, 2001FINAL UPDATE - 5/3/2001 kn4aq

In the maps, each significant "element" of the route has a number for reference. The numbers are a little cryptic because they're shortned to a 6 -character format that works for GPS receivers. There are a total of 69 elements, with \#00 being the starting line in Zebulon, and \#68 being the finish line at Festival Park in Manteo. Here's how to decode the element numbers:
turns: 01 RT $=$ turn $1-$ Right Turn (on the air, just say "turn 1")
rest stops: 03RS1A = element 3, Rest Stop 1 - Saturday (RS1B would be Rest Stop 1 - Sunday) (on the air, just say "rest stop 1") county lines: $06 \mathrm{CL}=$ element 6, County Line (on the air, call this "County Line 6") (the first two county lines crossed, right at the beginning of the course, are not marked)
crossroads: $02 \mathrm{CS}=$ element 2, Continue Straight. (on the air, call this "turn 2", even though it isn't a turn).
